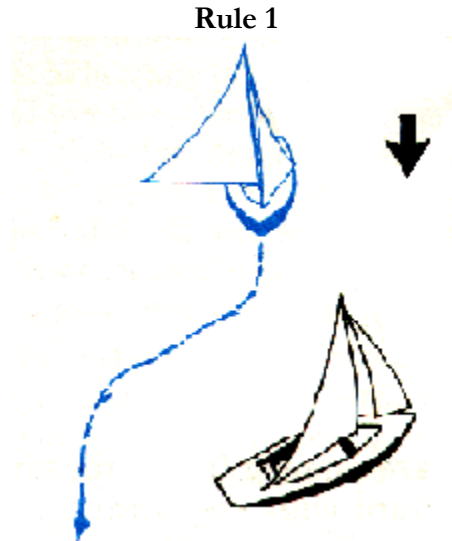


Rules of Sailing

Right of Way (ROW) Rule 1

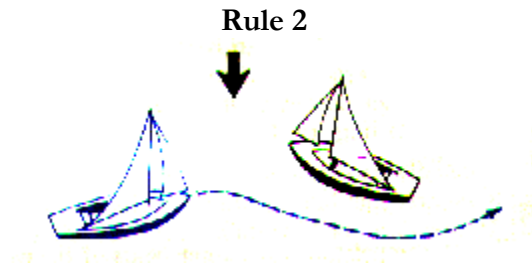
The arrow indicates the direction of the wind. The black boat is "privileged", and has the right-of-way. The blue boat is the "burdened" boat and must get out of the way.



A sailboat running free must keep clear of one close hauled.

Right of Way (ROW) Rule 2

The arrow indicates the direction of the wind. The black boat is "privileged", and has the right-of-way. The blue boat is the "burdened" boat and must get out of the way.

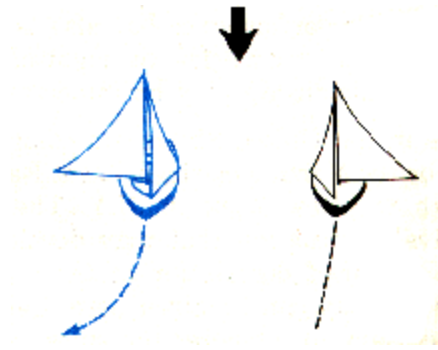


A sailboat close hauled on the port tack must keep clear of a sailboat close hauled on the starboard tack.

Right of Way (ROW) Rule 3

The arrow indicates the direction of the wind. The black boat is "privileged", and has the right-of-way. The blue boat is the "burdened" boat and must get out of the way.

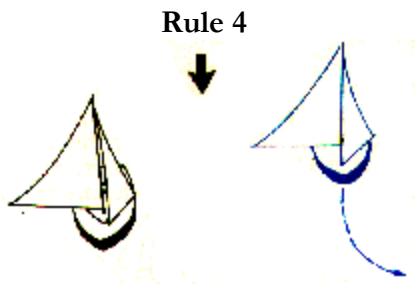
Rule 3



When both boats are running free on opposite tacks the vessel with the wind on the port side must keep clear

Right of Way (ROW) Rule 4

The arrow indicates the direction of the wind. The black boat is "privileged", and has the right-of-way. The blue boat is the "burdened" boat and must get out of the way.



When both boats are running free on the same tack the boat to windward must keep clear.
